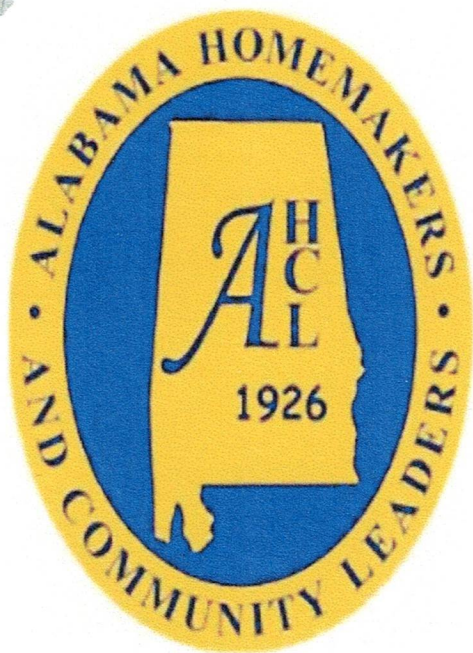

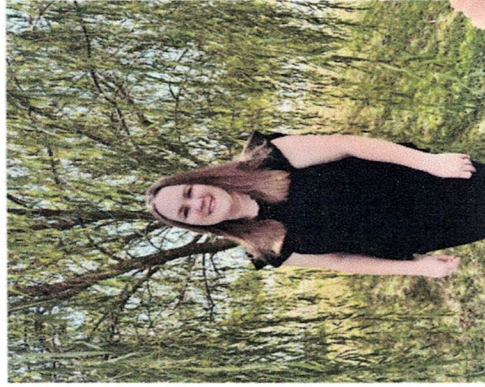

Sandy is a Dorothy Tate Scholarship recipient and uses her award to further her education in water coloring. She teaches art classes and crafts at various senior centers.



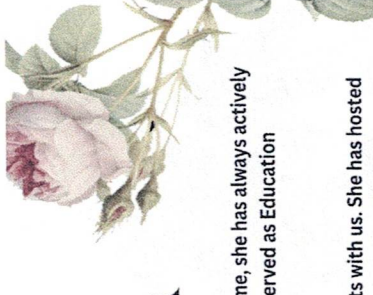
LOLA B. HARPER

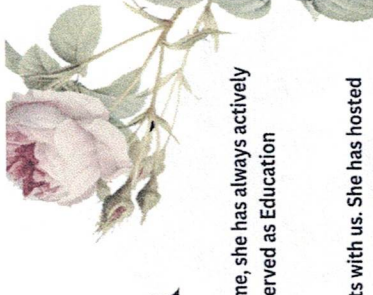
LEE ANN WILBORN

It also allows us to give generously to other nonprofits throughout the year. This is the 3rd yard sale she has spearheaded for our club. Our nominee for The Heart of Homemaker Award demonstrates her heart through her enthusiasm for all club-related things, which she generously and wholeheartedly supports. Her reliability is so evident in the execution of our yard sale fundraiser, and she inspires us with her creativity in sewing projects.
